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Indoor Activites!



In Pre-school room the children have been practising threading letters using shoelaces. Threading is a great activity to help children develop fine motor skills essential for being able to draw, write, do up buttons, tie shoelaces, open lunch boxes and more. Threading also helps to develop eye-hand coordination and concentration skills. Children learn language skills as they name colours, practise recognising and saying the letters from the alphabet. The children enjoy this as it gives them the opportunity to learn independently.

Water play!





This week in pre-school room the children have enjoyed water play. We put farm animals in the water with some bubble bath and children practised washing the farm animals. We encouraged the children to talk about what farm animals there are and what noises they make. Water play helps enhance the children's physical skills, it promotes language and social skills, it also helps to promote their sensory exploration when playing.

Arts and Crafts!



In baby room, the babies have been helping to make a cloud for their Autumn board using glue and tissue paper. They enjoyed exploring the texture of how the tissue paper felt. The babies did so well at following instructions and watching how to stick the tissue paper down. It helps the children to develop their hand-eye coordination and helps to promote their fine motor skills. Most children typically enjoy arts and crafts!!

Messy Play!



The toddlers have been painting this week using different stamps to make different marks. Painting activities is a way to promote children using their senses, it lets them explore different colours and to learn the names of colours. Painting can help them to express emotions and helps them to convey ideas. Painting is aslo a fun way for the children to communicate and play together if they wish.

Building Blocks



The babies have been learning how to stack blocks on top of each other this week. Building with blocks promotes children's fine and gross motor skills, it develops their problem-solving skills and mathematical skills. It also helps develop their attention skills; the babies were concentrating very well trying to make towers. It further allows the children to develop skills to do with spatial awareness and hand-eye coordination which is very important for growing babies and toddlers, it aslo allows the children to experiance the feeling of resilience as sometimes the blocks would fall and they would have to start again.
