RolePlay!



The babies have experienced shops in their role play this month. Role play activities help to promote children's communication and language it also promotes their personal, social and emotional development. Adding play tills promote the child's technological skills as they work out what buttons to press to make certain actions. The babies really enjoyed this activity.

Maths!





This month preschool children have been learning all about maths. We've been practising our counting and recognising our numbers up to 10. The children got cubes and correctly fitted them into spaces and then carefully using their finger counted how many cubes they had. Another activity which we did was finding numbers on a number tree to see if we were able to recognise some of our numbers. It can also help to improve their memory and concentration.

Foam!



The toddlers have enjoyed messy and sensory play this term. One activity we did was to explore shaving foam and adding toys to see if we could make marks with the foam. Messy and sensory play activities will help to promote children's language in learning new words to describe textures/feelings. It helps to promote their physical development and helps with their concentration as well as developing their curiosity.

Messy Play!



The babies have enjoyed lots of messy play activities this month! We squirted paint into our big tough tray and then let the babies explore using their bodies. The babies really enjoyed getting very messy making marks and feeling the texture of the paint on their body parts. Messy play activities promote a baby's physical development as well as helping to foster their curiosity, imagination and exploration.

Learning Colours!



This month the children in toddler room have been learning all about their colours. One activity that the toddlers did was to correctly try and match an object with the correct colour paper on the tray. The toddlers did so well and had very good concentration for the activity. Learning the colours is a milestone in early childhood and represents a child's cognitive understanding. Exposing children to and teaching them about the colours develops their visual perception – which is the ability of the brain to correctly interpret what the eyes see.
