
Welcome!

The pre-schoolers had lots of fun getting creative with paints. Leo and Selena were sharing ideas with one another and both decided to make handprints! Painting is one of the most enjoyable activities for children and also a fantastic way of supporting their learning and development and fine motor skills.

Water Play



As the weather has started to get warmer, the children have had the opportunity to explore the water outdoors. We added some pots and cups so the children could enjoy filling and pouring in to the tray. As well as developing their fine motor skills, this activity encourages children to socialise and understand the concept of sharing and turn taking.

'Splash'



The babies have enjoyed investigating the different coloured balls in the water tray. Carla was supporting Harper by showing her how to scoop up the balls and drop them back in to the water, creating a 'splash'. Water play develops motor skills and sensory exploration.

Reading Stories



Michelle and Kyle spent some time reading the story 'Mog and the Baby'. It is always beneficial to discuss the story after being read as this encouarges children to explore new ways to use vocabulary effectively. Storytelling is important for their creative and imaginative thinking. It gives them the opportunity to think for themselves and think critically. We have a large range of books at Little Marvels and the children have the choice of reading alone in 'free play' or joining in with others at 'story time'.

Dinosaur Land



Bhargav and Maxwell have enjoyed 'Dinosaur Land' that has been set up within the setting to provide children with a 'small world' experience. Small worlds, as well as being super fun, are the ideal activity to support children's imagination. It provides them with an opportunity to explore new materials, act out scenarios, build language and gain an understanding of the world around them.

Cutting our own fruit



We carried out our own risk assessment with the children and spoke about the importance of using a knife carefully. Veer was able to carefully use a knife to cut his own fruit. Activities like this encourage children to become more independent and will prepare them for 'school readiness'. It also helps develop their hand eye coordiantion. The children were all very excited to eat something they had prepared themselves.
